Aware that the Committees are yet to present Reports on the Bills, contrary to the provisions of Order Eighteen, Rule 11 (5) of the Standing Orders of the House of Representatives, to wit:

“(5) any matter referred to a Committee shall be treated within 30 days; otherwise, the Committee shall stand discharged after 60 days except upon a motion for an extension of t time which shall not exceed fifteen days and the matter committed to the Committee of the Whole or any other Committee as the Speaker may decide from time to time.”

Resolves to:

discharge the above-mentioned Committees on Bills referred to them and commit same to the Committee of the Whole.

**17. Need to Determine the Boundaries between Communities in Akpugoeze, Oji Local Government Area and Orumba North Local Government Area of Anambra State:
Hon. Anayo Onwuegbu:**

The House:

Notes that some Communities in Oji River Local Government Area, Enugu State, are situated in the border area between Enugu State and Orumba North Local Government Area, Anambra State;

Also notes that the Oji River Communities are the ancestral owners of the Mmamu forest reserve and farm settlement in the border area;

Aware that the indigenes of Oji River clans leased out part of the land to Ukwuenu Aro settlers, who later developed into smaller Communities known as Ubani, Ozu, and Okpeze (now Ukwuenu communities), with the inhabitants being customary tenants to Akpugoeze clan paying royalty to the owners of the land.

Also aware that the tenancy status of these communities is documented in 1911 and 1933 tenancy agreements;

Concerned that despite the National Boundary Commission and Office of the Surveyor General of the Federation's awareness of the dispute, and the meetings held by both state governments with concerned communities, which led to the establishment of a Joint Field Team (JFT) on December 15, 2006, to resolve the lingering boundary delineation process, the process has been unduly delayed.

Worried that the delay has caused hardship to the true and ancestral owners of the area, who accommodated their brothers only for them to lay claim to the land;

Resolves to:

- (i) urge the National Boundary Commission and Office of the Surveyor General of the Federation to carry out fieldwork and demarcate the boundaries between the Communities of Akpugoeze clan in Enugu State and Rumba North Local Government Area in Anambra State to resolve the interstate boundary disputes;

- (ii) mandate the Committees on Special Duties and Works to liaise with the National Boundary Commission and Office of the Surveyor General of the Federation to ensure the delineation process is completed within twenty-four (24) weeks;
- (iii) also mandate the Committee on Legislative Compliance to ensure compliance.

18. Indiscriminate Sale of Land and Public Assets in Federal Housing Authority FHA/ENL Estates, Guzape:

Hon. Esosa Iyawe:

The House:

Notes that the Federal Housing Authority Paradise Hills Estate Guzape, built in collaboration with the ENL Consortium, is a unique development, well planned in an exquisite layout and good topography, surrounded by hills for security and fully sold out;

Also notes that having sold the buildings, the developers are indiscriminately mining the hills made of sand to provide security cover and geographical stability for the estate to create additional plots;

Cognisant that the hill loses its texture during the rainy season and creates mudslides that make some of the estate roads impassable;

Concerned that the heavy rainfall will exacerbate the already precarious situation of estate roads and adjoining houses, while the daily mining activities are causing tremors in Guzape and its immediate environs, undermining the structural integrity of the buildings in the locations;

Worried that the indiscriminate mining of the surrounding hills is a threat to government estates in Guzape and private properties with consequential loss of lives;

Also worried that most estates in the FCT, like the FHA/ENL consortium, go off-plan, allocating areas not within the original master plan when selling to prospective buyers;

Resolves to:

- (i) urge the Federal Capital Development Authority to provide clarification and monitor development of the Federal Housing Authority Paradise Hills Estate, Guzape, and other estates in the Federal Capital Territory; and
- (ii) mandate the Committees on Public Assets, Housing and Habitat, and FCT to investigate and halt further allocation and development of plots not in the master plan of the FHA/ENL Estate in Guzape and other government estates in FCT.

19. Need to Rehabilitate the Failed Portions of Port Harcourt – Owerri Federal Road Network in Rivers State:

Hon. Boniface Sunday Emerengwa:

The House:

Notes that the primary duty of government, as enshrined in Section 14(2)(b) of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria, 1999 (as amended), is to provide for the welfare and security of its citizens.

Also notes that the Port Harcourt-Owerri Road, particularly the section cutting across Igwuruta, Omagwa, Isiokpo, Elele, and Omerelu communities in Ikwerre Local Government Area of Rivers State, is in a deplorable state.

Cognizant that the Igwuruta-Omerelu section of the road is a federal road under the maintenance of the Federal Government through relevant Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs).

Concerned that the road's poor condition has led to hardship for the immediate communities, prompting the Rivers State Government to undertake rehabilitation efforts in the past two decades.

Regrets that the road's condition has deteriorated, exposing commuters and motorists to armed robbery and kidnapping.

Acknowledges that the Port Harcourt-Owerri road is a critical route linking the North to the South, which now takes over four hours to traverse due to the poor condition.

Worried about the excruciating pains and untold hardship faced by commuters due to the unending gridlock on the failed portion of the road.

Disturbed that heavy-duty vehicles are forced to use alternative routes within communities, creating hazards for pedestrians and damaging internal roads.

Convinced that immediate intervention will restore confidence, improve security, and galvanize economic activities.

Resolves to:

- (i) urge the Federal Ministry of Works and the Federal Roads Maintenance Agency (FERMA) to include the rehabilitation of the failed portion of the road in the 2026 budget estimates to ameliorate the plight of commuters and motorists;
- (ii) mandate the Committees on Work and Federal Roads Maintenance Agency to ensure compliance and report within four (4) weeks for further legislative action.
